LB 396 (DeKay) Change provisions relating to the form and filing of public power district budgets and audits with the Nebraska Power Review Board – Removes the requirement by Public Power Districts to submit an annual budget report to PRB;

Natural Resources Committee hearing on Thursday, February 6<sup>th</sup>.

**Advanced to General File** 

LB 413 (Clouse) Change provisions relating to the setting of rates by certain power districts "Rates and charges may be differentiated based on load size, load factor, firm and nonfirm service, technology risks, length of service commitment, and other objective criteria."
